TERMS OF REFERENCE

TREATMENT AND DISPOSAL OF HAZARDOUS WASTE TO ACCREDITED TREATMENT CENTERS

I. BACKGROUND

Section 28 of Republic Act 9003 or the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000 states that "toxic materials present in the waste stream should be separated at source, collected separately, and further screened and sent to appropriate hazardous waste treatment and disposal plants, consistent with the provisions of R.A. No. 6969". Examples of these types of waste, which is generated by the City are busted fluorescent bulbs, used industrial oil/Genset oil, used batteries, waste electrical & electronic equipment, contaminated containers and used cooking oil. These types of wastes should be stored separately and undergo treatment before disposal. Treatment should be done by a Treatment, Storage and Disposal (TSD) provider. The treated wastes should be directly disposed in a different cell in a accredited sanitary landfill. Special hazardous wastes should not be mixed or stored with regular domestic wastes generated.

II. BUDGETARY REQUIREMENT

The Approved Budget for the Contract (ABC) for the disposal of Hazardous Waste to Accredited Treatment Centers is in the amount of NINE HUNDRED NINETY NINE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED SIXTY (PhP 999,960.00).

III. OBJECTIVES

The objectives for the disposal of hazardous wastes are as follows:

1. To properly dispose special/hazardous waste for the full implementation of RA 9003 and RA 6969;
2. Prevent undue exposure to chemical hazards

IV. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

During the implementation of the contract, the service provider shall ensure the following:

1. The service provider should conform to the Minimum standards on the operation of Transport, Storage and Disposal (TSD) provider as per Republic Act 6969, thus, it should secure all required documents and accreditation from the Environmental Management Bureau;
2. The service provider should have a Memorandum of Agreement with accredited sanitary landfill for the disposal of treated special hazardous waste, or an acceptable alternative technology approved by the Environmental Management Bureau and the Department of Science and Technology;
3. Provide service in good condition for the collection of waste and ensure uninterrupted service;
4. Shoulder all other expenses outside the contract that are incurred in the duration of service; and
5. Take full responsibility and liability for trucks and drivers in case of any untoward incident;

V. DELIVERABLES BY THE SERVICE PROVIDER AND THE CITY GOVERNMENT


The deliverables of the service provider shall be as follows:

- a. Provide service vehicle for collection, and shoulder all expenses for the entire duration of the service.
- b. Provide the CENRO, submit required collection reports and summary on a monthly basis.

The deliverable of the City Government shall be:

1. Issue payment for monthly collection/services completed with corresponding Statement of Account and attached Summary Waste Collection from CENRO and all the deliverables and reports are submitted.
