TERMS OF REFERENCE

SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF FRIDGE TAG TO BE USED DURING THE 2-DAY BASIC EPI AND COLD CHAIN MANAGEMENT TRAINING OF THE CITY HEALTH OFFICE FOR 2024 IN THE CITY OF SAN FERNANDO, PAMPANGA

I. BACKGROUND

Immunization is one of the most effective and cost-effective methods for preventing the spread of infectious diseases. Vaccines stimulate the immune system to recognize and fight specific pathogens, thereby reducing the risk of infection, complications, and transmission. National Immunization Program aims to protect individuals and communities from a range of vaccine-preventable diseases, such as measles, polio, influenza, hepatitis, and more.

The City of San Fernando is one of the areas with numerous numbers of suspected and confirmed measles in the region. Based from the City Epidemiological and Surveillance Unit report, there were 2 measles cases (suspect) in 2022 and 2021.

The Department of Health conducted a Measles Rubella OPV Supplemental Immunization Activity (MR-bOPV SIA) last May 2 to June 15, 2023 to address the increasing number of measles cases in the country.

The city government will likewise continuously provide COVID-19 vaccination services to all eligible priority groups as part of its COVID 19 response.

II. BUDGETARY REQUIREMENT

The budgetary requirement for the SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF FRIDGE TAG TO BE USED DURING THE 2-DAY BASIC EPI AND COLD CHAIN MANAGEMENT TRAINING OF THE CITY HEALTH OFFICE FOR 2024 of the City Health Office in the City of San Fernando, Pampanga is included in the PPMP with the Ref. No. 2024-899 and is already included in the Annual Procurement Plan (APP) of the City Government, which is in the amount of EIGHTY TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED PESOS (82,500.00).

III. OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF FRIDGE TAG TO BE USED DURING THE 2-DAY BASIC EPI AND COLD CHAIN MANAGEMENT TRAINING OF THE CITY HEALTH OFFICE FOR 2024 IN THE CITY OF SAN FERNANDO, PAMPANGA are as follows

- To achieve 95% of fully immunized children.
- To establish effective measles and fever surveillance.
- To vaccinate all eligible population against measles.
- Sustain Polio Free City of San Fernando.
- To effectively manage vaccines and immunization logistics.

IV. COVERAGE/SERVICES

The City Health Office continues to implement strategies that would increase the
awareness of the public and strengthens its measures in terms of prevention and
monitoring of measles and COVID 19 cases. One of which is the fever surveillance
in all puroks in every barangay and Measles Outbreak Response Immunization on
high risk puroks.

V. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

During the procurement process and delivery/implementation of the contract, the enduser and the supplier/ contractor shall:

- a. Specifications/Schedule of Requirements
 - The warranty date of the items requested should be at least TWO (2) YEARS OF TWENTY-FOUR (24) MONTHS upon delivery and should be in good condition and packaging.

b. Procurement Process

- For the End- user, ensure the completion of the documents in order to proceed with the procurement process.
- For the supplier/ provider, ensure the completeness of the documents being required by the Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) for the procurement process on- time based on the procurement schedule including this TOR duly signed by the end- user and confirmed by the supplier/ provider.
- If the procurement process reaches the ensuing year, observe that the allowed delivery is only up to what is stipulated in the contract.
- For the End- user, present clearly this TOR during the Pre- Bid Conference for the information of the prospective bidder/s (for Competitive/ Public Bidding), and present by the Buyer with the assistance of the End- user (for Alternative Methods of Procurement).
- Ensure that there are readily- available supplies upon submission of Request for Quotation (RFQ)/ Bid since delivery is anticipated upon issuance of PO/ Contract.
- Comply with the provisions of the Procurement Law regardless of the mode of procurement, whether Competitive/ Public Bidding or the use of Alternative Methods of Procurement.

c. Delivery/ Implementation period

- Strictly observe the "No Purchase Order (PO)/ Contracts, No Delivery" Policy and comply with the delivery period.
- The Delivery Period shall be on APRIL 2024.
- During the delivery, strictly follow the provisions enumerated in the Terms and Condition of the PO/ Contract including the Delivery Schedule, Penalty, among others.
- In case there is a change in the Delivery Schedule and specifications, the Enduser through the Procurement Officer shall coordinate with the CGSO-Procurement Management Division (PMD) for the latter to advise the supplier/contractor regarding the concern.
- Coordination with the supplier/ contractor shall be the function of the CGSO- PMD as its mandate.
- For onsite delivery, ensure the coordination with the Inspector from the CGSO-Property and Supply Management Division (PSMD) for the inspection of the

delivery in terms of quantity and quality of items and to immediately notify the supplier/ contractor in case of any concerns before the acceptance.

d. Inspection and Acceptance

Prepared and submitted by:

- 1. The CGSO- PSMD shall inspect and accept the delivery.
- 2. The supplier/contractor shall present the PO and issue Sales Invoice.
- 3. The CGSO- PSMD shall prepare the corresponding Inspection and Acceptance Report/s.

Such documents will be used in notifying the concerned offices on the delivery such as the City Accountant's Office (CAccO) and Commission on Audit (COA) to include the same in the Payables.

VI. DELIVERABLES BY THE SUPPLIER/ CONTRACTOR AND THE CITY GOVERNMENT

The deliverables of the supplier/ contractor shall be as follows:

- a. Provide the quantity of item being required by the project/program; and
- b. Strictly follow the specifications and timely provision of requirements based on the delivery schedule.

The deliverables of the City Government shall be as follows:

- a. On- time payment of the supplier/ contractor i.e., 15 days after delivery regardless if the delivery is per month or Ordering Agreement.
- b. End- user shall monitor the delivery of requirements.
- c. The Procurement Officer shall assist in the monitoring, delivery and on-time payment of the supplier.
- d. Provide necessary and readily- available documents such as during the conduct of post- audit.
- e. Evaluate the performance of the supplier/ contractor and in case there is a violation to the Contract/ Agreement, prepare a Verified Report.
