## TERMS OF REFERENCE

### **SUPPLY AND DELIVERY OF MEALS TO BE SERVED FOR THE VARIOUS ACTIVITIES OF THE INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM 2025 IN THE CITY OF SAN FERNANDO, PAMPANGA SUBJECT TO ORDERING AGREEMENT.**

#### **I.BACKGROUND**

Pursuant to the Sanguniang Panlungsod Ordinance no. 2014-010, An Ordinance amending SP Ordinance No. 2012-003m, otherwise known as the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Code (CDRRMC).

In Chapter 4 Section 8, The City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council came into form through Republic Act No. 10121. As embodied in this Act, the existing City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils shall henceforth be known as the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council.

Thus, there shall be established in this city a City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (CDRRMC).

Section 12. - *Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (LDRRMO)*. – (c) The provincial, city and municipal DRRMOs or BDRRMCs shall perform the following functions with impartiality given the emerging challenges brought by disasters of our times:

(8) Conduct continuous disaster monitoring and mobilize instrumentalities and entities of the LGUs, CSOs, private groups and organized volunteers, to utilize their facilities and resources for the protection and preservation of life and properties during emergencies in accordance with existing policies and procedures;

(13) Develop, strengthen and operationalize mechanisms for partnership or networking with the private sector, CSOs, and volunteer groups;

#### **II.BUDGETARY REQUIREMENT**

The Budgetary Requirement for the Supply and Delivery of Meals to be served for the various Activities of the Incident Management Team 2025 in the City of San Fernando, Pampanga subject to Ordering Agreement, is included in the PPMP in the amount of THREE HUNDRED FOURTY THREE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED PESOS (P 343,500.00).

#### **III.OBJECTIVES**

1. To ensure safety, security, and orderly conduct of VARIOUS ACTIVITIES FOR THE INCIDENT MANAGEMENT TEAM (IMTs) 2025 IN THE CITY OF SAN FERNANDO, PAMPANGA.
2. To provide the necessary basic assistance at the course of the said activity.

#### **IV.TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

During the procurement process and delivery/ implementation of the contract, the end-user and the supplier/ contractor shall:

- a. Specifications/ Schedule of Requirements

- b. Procurement Process

1. For the End-user, ensure the completion of the documents in order to proceed with the procurement process.
2. For the supplier/provider, ensure the completeness of the documents being required by the Bids and Awards Committee (BAC) for the procurement process on- time based

on the procurement schedule including this TOR duly signed by the end-user and conformed by the supplier/contractor.

3. If the procurement process reaches the ensuing year, observe that the allowed delivery is only up to what is stipulated in the contract.
4. Ensure to supply the requirements upon issuance of DOC.
5. Comply with the provisions of the Procurement Law regardless of the mode of procurement, whether Competitive/Public Bidding or the use of Alternative Methods of Procurement.

c. Delivery/ Implementation period

1. Strictly observe the “No Purchase Order (PO)/ Delivery Order Contract (DOC), No Delivery” Policy and comply with the delivery period.
2. The Delivery Period shall be on JANUARY-DECEMBER 2025.
3. During the delivery, strictly follow the provisions enumerated in the Terms and Condition of the PO/ Contract including the Delivery Schedule, Penalty, among others.
4. In case there is a change in the Delivery Schedule and specifications, the End- user through the Procurement Officer shall coordinate with the CGSO-Procurement Management Division (PMD) for the latter to advise the supplier/contractor regarding the concern.
5. Coordination with the supplier/ contractor shall be the function of the CGSO-PMD as its mandate.
6. For onsite delivery, ensure the coordination with the Inspector from the CGSO-Property and Supply Management Division (PSMD) for the inspection of the delivery in terms of quantity and quality and to immediately notify the supplier/contractor in case of any concerns before the acceptance.

d. Inspection and Acceptance

1. The End- user shall accept the delivery with the (1) delivery receipts, and submit immediately to the Inspector or CGSO- PSMD together with the (2) attendance sheets as part of the utilization where the quantity of the delivery is the same as the number of attendees and photo documentation of the delivery.

Such documents will be used in notifying the concerned offices on the delivery such as the City Accountant’s Office (CAccO) and Commission on Audit (COA) to include the same in the Payables

## **V.DELIVERABLES BY THE SUPPLIER/ CONTRACTOR AND THE CITY GOVERNMENT**

The deliverables of the supplier/ contractor shall be as follows:

- a. Provide the quantity of meals required by the project/ program; and
- b. Strictly follow the specifications and timely provision of requirements based on the delivery schedule.

The deliverables of the City Government shall be as follows:

- a. On- time payment of the supplier/ contractor i.e., 15 days after the month.
- b. End- user shall monitor the delivery of requirements.
- c. The Procurement Officer shall assist in the monitoring, delivery and on-time payment of the supplier.
- d. Provide necessary and readily-available documents such as during the conduct of post-audit.
- e. Evaluate the performance of the supplier/contractor and in case there is a violation to the Contract/Agreement, prepare a Verified Report.
